## CALL FOR ENTRIES FOR SPECIAL VIDEO PROJECT ON OFW FRONTLINERS

To recognize the selfless and noble service of our OFWs, the Department of Foreign Affairs has requested the assistance of the Philippine Embassies and Consulates around the world to get in touch with the Filipino communities to participate in a special video project.

Below are the project material guidelines:

## 1. VIDEO SUBMISSION

The face of the OFW must be very visible because we want to show the "people behind the mask" and give recognition to them.
